

# Education

The Museum's student programs are vital links between the permanent and visiting collections and the many communities that we hope to serve.

Dalí's life and art afford numerous opportunities for students, teachers, scholars and interested individuals and groups to explore a wide range of topics, engage the mind, and reflect on the human experience.



## school programs



### FREE School Tours

The Dalí Museum hosts over 7,000 students on group tours each year. These tours are the core of the Museum's education programming, and tours remain FREE for students and their teachers.

### DALÍVISION Outreach Programs

The DalíVISION Outreach program consists of slide, poster or visual lectures presented by Museum docents at the request of community and education groups.

### STUDENT SURREALIST Art Exhibits

The annual Student Surrealist Art Exhibits present approximately 100 works by Pinellas and Hillsborough Counties middle and high school students demonstrating the ongoing popularity and attraction of Surrealism for new generations of artists.

### ENTERPRISE VILLAGE DALÍ Poster Exhibit

Enterprise Village is an economic education program providing hands-on learning experiences to over 17,000 5th grade students a year. As part of the program, each student chooses a career for a day. The Dalí Museum sponsors the Curator career at the Model Art Center program.

### BREAKFASTS with Dalí

A monthly event for children ages 5 to 12 and their adult companions. Families explore the Dalí Museum collection through lively discussions and gallery activities. This interactive tour is led by a Dalí docent who has chosen Dalí paintings and other works which specially appeal to children. The tour is followed by a breakfast with the docent and then arts and crafts. This is a great opportunity for children and families to discuss their experience.

### DALÍ JUNIOR DOCENT Summer Camp

Expanding on the successful adult docent program, children ages 8 to 12 spend one week in a class meeting new friends and learning about Surrealism, Salvador Dalí, and the Dalí Museum collection in order to lead their own public tour. This in-depth exploration of the world of Dalí builds leadership skills and promotes self-esteem.

### RECREATION CENTER Art Workshops

An innovative series of five summer workshops offered to at-risk inner-city students in St. Petersburg City Recreation Centers. The workshops provide 10 hours of close, sustained contact between students and instructors, developing the student's self-esteem, an understanding of Dalí and Surrealism and by guiding them through project creation.

### DALÍ PICTURE Person Program

In partnership with Academy Prep, a scholarship-based school for economically disadvantaged urban middle school students, The Dalí Museum provides a group of instructors who visit the school four times a year to create student-focused dialogues about Dalí, his peers and his influences.

### KIDS...DILLYDALLY with Dalí

Children can discover the creative world of Dalí every day in the Education Classroom with stories, puzzles and activities which educate and encourage family interaction. We begin every weekday at 10:30 with a story hour featuring selected books from the Dalí Museum library and store. Activities and puzzles are available daily through 5:30 p.m. to allow families to explore the Museum on their own. On Saturdays, guests can Dillydally with Dalí exploring fun games, puzzles, unique arts and crafts and take home activities.

**DALÍ FAMILY FUN Saturdays**

Dillydally with Dalí every Saturday with fun games, puzzles and unique arts & craft activities which educate and encourage family interaction. In addition, building bingo and a children's treasure hunt is available that enables families to independently explore the collection on their own and discover the magic of Dalí.

**YOGA + DALÍ**

Every Sunday at the New Dalí – a remarkable environment where Dalí's energy infuses the physical, mental and spiritual inspiration of yoga. Classes held in the Community Room or Avant-Garden, both with incredible views of the waterfront. Classes are vinyasa/ashtanga-based incorporating pranayama (breath work), asana (posture work), meditation and relaxation. Beginners and experienced yogis are welcome.

**COFFEE WITH A Curator**

A special monthly visual presentation given by one of the Dalí Museum's Curatorial/Education team held on the first Wednesday of each month. Join us for complimentary coffee in the Raymond James Community Room at 10:15 followed at 10:30 by a focused, theme-oriented presentation on a variety of Dalí-related topics.

**AUDIO GUIDES**

Learn about the collection through a free audio guide. One-hour long tours in English and Spanish focus on over 30 key paintings and objects of the collection, as well as features of the building. A children's tour is also available, focusing on 15 key works that appeal specially to young viewers.

**TEACHERS' TRIBUTE CELEBRATION + Reception**

A collaboration between the Dalí Museum, the Holocaust Museum and the Museum of Fine Arts for 200 multidisciplinary teachers from Pinellas and Hillsborough counties plus surrounding counties. Buses transport teachers between the three museums, where they enjoy a variety of appetizers and tour the museums. Teachers receive trade points for attending the education mixer, which in addition to the tours, receive information about diverse teaching resources and suggestions about how to incorporate new content from the three museums into their curricula.

**3.14 Pi DAY**

The Dalí Museum celebrates Pinellas County math teachers on a unique day: Pi Day, in honor of the famous irrational number. Teachers visit the Museum for an evening reception to tour the collection and the math-themed aspects of the Museum, like the Avant-Garden, listen to a talk about the connection of math to Dalí's art as well as receive resources that incorporate the content into the curricula.

**DANCE**

The Museum hosts dance troupes to perform in its unique spaces. The work often directly relates to the collection - the dancers transform the space while performing to live music.

**AVANT MUSIC Series**

In order to foster interdisciplinary creativity, the Museum hosts a music series and a music festival—the emit Series of Experimental Music and the Dalí Music from the Outside Series. These programs are held for the enrichment of the community and imply connections between the visual and musical arts. The programs compliment each other, with the emit Series presenting local and national musicians who perform avant-garde contemporary improvisational music, and the Dalí Music from the Outside Series focusing on unusual music making by Tampa Bay Area musicians.

**SIGN LANGUAGE Tours**

Tours of the Museum collection are interpreted in American Sign Language for the Deaf and Hard-of Hearing by request.

**SURREAL FRIDAYS**

A summer after-hours event, Surreal Friday is an evening of tours of the Museum, live jazz and Surreal-related silent films. Fridays in July and August.

**HISPANIC HERITAGE**

The Dalí Museum celebrates the Hispanic heritage of the artist, specifically in September and October with guided tours of the collection in Spanish, as well as a film series from Spanish directors and lectures focusing on this aspect of the Museum collection.

**DALÍ + ILLUSION Exhibition**

A special exhibition in the Education Gallery that explores Dalí's fascination with optical illusions. Includes a primer on traditional optical illusions as well as reproductions of works by Dalí.

**DALÍ & BEYOND Film Series**

This Dalí & Beyond Film Series features movies that share a common enthusiasm for fantasy, dreams, creativity and the imagination. Films show every first and third Thursday at 6 pm. Free admission.
