Dalí Alive, Denver, Colorado, 2022

Premiered in Denver, Colorado, in Fall 2022, *Dalí Alive* is a large-scale, dynamically animated and captivating experience that brings Salvador Dalí's work beyond the walls of The Dalí Museum.

In partnership with Grande Experiences, the Museum amplified the artist's transformative story to reach a wider audience. Those unable to visit The Dalí and our customized *Dalí Alive 360°* experience can now experience Salvador Dalí's genius and impact through this traveling exhibit, furthering the Museum's mission.

Dalí Alive redefines the way U.S. audiences can connect with art and culture while exploring how the artist continually reinvented himself to overcome obstacles.

the dalí dome

The Dalí Museum is the first museum to create a 360-degree dome structure to house digital art experiences, like *Dalí Alive 360*°. Spanning a 2-year timeline from conception to finish, The Dalí Dome stands 39 feet tall and 60 feet wide with a geodesic design that complements The Dalí Museum's free-form enigma.

Crafted with Dali's painting, *The Disintegration of the Persistence of Memory*, in mind, The Dome's outer covering displays one of the artist's most iconic symbols: the melting watch.

With over 500 structural-grade carbon steel rods and a specialized architectural-grade inner covering, the structure is designed to withstand the waterfront location's potential floods and hurricanes.
