arriving at the museum:

Outside the Museum's entrance, you will find a grotto featuring plants and a fountain.

Lockers are available for storing backpacks. If you need to bring medical supplies inside, please inform security.

Our security staff uses detection wands, bag checks, thermal scanning and metal detectors. If you or someone in your group is sensitive to these procedures, please inform staff and we will assist as needed.

ground floor

admissions

Upon arrival, you may need to wait briefly in a line to check in.

Wristbands must be worn when visiting the Museum. If your wristband is too tight or too loose, a staff member will be happy to assist you with resizing it.

information station

This is where you can ask questions and receive details about the Museum's mobile guide.

store

The Museum store offers a variety of items, some for touching and others not. Please ask staff before touching.

This area may have a short line.

theater

The theater plays a short film about Salvador Dalí. It is dimly lit and may have other guests.

café gala

The café can be loud and may have strong smells. Seats are available both inside and outside.

This area may have a crowd or a line.

dalí lives

Two digital screens allow you to interact with Dalí as he tells stories. His voice can be loud and surprising.

avant-garden

Noise levels can be a bit louder due to street traffic and the wind off the water.

the dalí dome

dalí alive 360°

This experience includes loud music and flashing lights. Please check with a visitor experience member to see if it's right for you.

third floor

galleries

Noise levels in this area are usually quite low. Occasionally, special exhibits may include music, lights or video.

These spaces can sometimes be crowded, so it may take a moment before you can view a painting.

Temperatures can vary, but it is typically cold in the galleries.

Audio tours are available through the Bloomberg Connects mobile guide—look for the QR code.

contemplation room

Inside the permanent collection, there is a quiet space to rest.

ask dalí

This experience features interactive conversations through a telephone. The voice and surrounding area may be loud.

sensory map:

This map highlights sensory elements throughout The Dalí Museum, including areas with tactile, auditory and visual features to help you navigate.
