



the dalí museum *library & archive*



With over 6,000 items documenting Salvador Dalí's life, work and Surrealist connections, our library spans multiple languages—including English, Catalan, Spanish and French—and features correspondence, journals, rare books, exhibition catalogs, photographs and unique ephemera such as the Morse Archives, which contain personal writings and letters from Museum founders Eleanor and A. Reynolds Morse. Select materials are available online, expanding access, supporting scholarship and powering research for upcoming exhibitions.

This year, the Library & Archive hosted mural artists as they explored the collection for *Outside In: New Murals Inspired by Dalí* and, through collaboration with archivists and librarians, strengthened our partnership with the USF Library, earning our curators recognition as Courtesy Faculty.

conserving *the dalí collection*

Paintings are created with organic materials that naturally change and age over time, requiring careful attention to preserve their integrity. With support from our Annual Fund *Keepers of the Collection* donors, we conserved three paintings this year, each with treatments tailored to its needs. Some works were surface cleaned and re-tensioned; others required varnish removal, paint consolidation or the filling of losses. Together, these efforts ensure Dalí's art remains vibrant and preserved for generations to come.

Reimagining Nature: Dalí's Floral Fantasies

May 18 – Oct 27, 2024

Showcasing three rarely seen suites of botanical prints created by Dalí between 1968 and 1972, this exhibition explored his works on paper and highlighted how he reinterpreted traditional images of fruits and flowers and transformed them into surreal, vibrant creations.

Dalí: Disruption and Devotion at MFA, Boston

The exhibition juxtaposed nearly 30 paintings and prints on loan from The Dalí with European masterpieces from the MFA's renowned collection, offering 234,000 visitors a rare dialogue between Dalí's vision and the European tradition that shaped him.

Opened in 2011, our iconic building was designed to protect Dalí's work, host exhibitions and serve as a hub for education. In 2024, it withstood two hurricanes without damage to the structure or collection, affirming the strength of its original design. 



Demographic breakdown of our visitors




Through three annual exhibitions, Florida middle and high school students explore themes central to Dalí and the Surrealists. The *“Obsession, Disintegration, Reinvention”* exhibition introduced student artists to Dalí’s recurring symbols and constant self-invention.



Free & Reduced Admission Student Field Trips



K-12 school groups receive free and reduced admission, including in-person or virtual docent-led tours of the Museum’s permanent collection, offering a meaningful introduction to art. Dalí Museum field trips deepen classroom connections, strengthen observational and perceptual skills, foster social development and help students engage more confidently and personally with art.

educating *students*

Junior Docent Program

Students ages 9–14 spend a week at The Dalí in four full-day summer sessions, exploring the permanent collection as a living curriculum. Through hands-on experiences, they discover new ways to interpret and create art, build confidence and develop critical thinking skills. Empowered to think independently, students graduate as Dalí Museum Junior Docents. Each week concludes with a tour led by the new docents and a family reception, where students showcase their Dalí knowledge, personal voice and surreal creations.



Building on this foundation, the Junior Docent Ambassador program launched this year, enabling graduates to share their knowledge year-round. Ambassadors presented at Museum events, including *Keepers of the Collection*, Board meetings and Arts Alive Day, as well as off-site at the Florida Art Education Association conference and before the St. Petersburg City Council.

Funded by the Jeannine Hascall Junior Docent Program Endowment Fund, the program provides scholarships, ensuring students from all backgrounds can shape the next generation of creative thinkers.

Summer Rec Center Program

For 25 years, The Dalí's innovative summer program has opened doors for Title 1 students, introducing them to the vast world of Salvador Dalí, Surrealism and creative expression. Each summer, 60 students engage in a series of five Dalí-inspired workshops across six St. Petersburg City Recreation Centers and throughout the community, receiving 10 hours of dynamic art instruction led by dedicated Visual Arts teachers and teaching artists.

The program fosters creativity and confidence as students explore the Museum's collection and create their own original artwork. Every session includes a free gallery tour at The Dalí, culminating in a family reception with complimentary Museum access to celebrate the students' achievements.



Made possible through the generosity of an anonymous donor, this program continues to transform lives by empowering young people to discover their own artistic voices.

The Key to Dalí Art Mobile

Marking our 18th year serving the county with the Art Mobile, this traveling gallery brings Salvador Dalí's art and story directly to Pinellas County elementary schools, encouraging students to think creatively, embrace their individuality and engage more deeply with visual art. The Art Mobile equips teachers with resources to cultivate learning and guide meaningful classroom conversations through art.






In partnership with Pinellas County Schools, starting in Fall 2025, the new Art Mobile will reach 38,000 students across 77 schools by 2030.






